Should the Church be involved in the community?

I once was challenged by a Christian minister who didn't understand why I placed particular emphasis on church involvement in the community. He said, "Servitude should not take precedence over evangelism." I responded, "Are they not one and the same?"

Now, allow me to qualify my response – Without question, I believe there is no greater cause than striving to see a person exercise their faith and receive Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior over their life. I also know that "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." And that this verse is preceded with the question, "...How will they hear without a preacher? (Romans 10)"

Evangelism and preaching of the Word is essential to Kingdom-mindedness and harvest-reaping. But, nevertheless, the apostle Paul said in James 2:14, "What good is your faith if you don't show it by your actions?" Paul even goes on to beg the question, "Can that faith save anyone?"

Instead, he shook off religiousity and just went to them – meeting them right at their point of need.

Today, I encourage you, every pastor and church leader in the Parma area, to be COURAGEOUS enough to reach beyond the four walls of your buildings. I challenge you to seek diligently and fervently for the opportunities to serve that exist all around you in this community. The needs are many and they are great. Individually, we know can each make a difference. But, only through prayer, unity, and collaboration, can we, as the Body of Christ, do MORE for the Greater Cause within our community!
